


API linking patient portals, electronic health record (EHR) systems, or health IT systems to targeted health information (patient education) from MedlinePlus.gov

Type of Code	Code System
Problems/Diagnoses	ICD-9-CM ICD-10-CM SNOMED CT
Medications	RXCUI NDC
Labs	LOINC

Clinical system

Two versions: Application & Service

Web Application	Web Service
Queried via an HL7-compliant, URL-based information request	
Accepts queries for problems (diagnoses), medications, and lab tests.	
Returns an HTML page with links and (for problems) an image and a snippet of a summary.	Returns an HL7-compliant response in XML, JSON, or JSONP format.
Easier to implement.	More flexible.

Sending a problem/diagnosis code returns

- brief summary
- link to **Health Topic Page** and **Patient Handouts** on **MedlinePlus.gov**

Heart Attack

Also called: MI, Myocardial infarction

Each year over a million people in the U.S. have a heart attack. About half of them die. Many people have permanent heart damage or die because they don't get help immediately. It's important to know the symptoms of a heart attack and call 9-1-1 if someone is having them. Those symptoms include

- Chest discomfort - pressure, squeezing, or pain
- Shortness of breath
- Discomfort in the upper body - arms, shoulder, neck, back
- Nausea, vomiting, dizziness, lightheadedness, sweating

These symptoms can sometimes be different in [women](#).

What exactly is a heart attack? Most heart attacks happen when a [clot](#) in the coronary artery blocks the supply of blood and oxygen to the heart. Often this leads to an irregular heartbeat - called an [arrhythmia](#) - that causes a severe decrease in the pumping function of the heart. A blockage that is not treated within a few hours causes the affected heart muscle to die.
